

A Message from the Executive Director

Dear Society Members and Friends,

Thank you to everyone who participated and attended HSCC's 85th Anniversary Variety Show on June 6th! It was a fun night capped off by some major announcements about the Society's campus and how it will change in the coming months and years.



Here are three major takeaways:

• Work on the beautification and accessibility improvements of the walkways, entrances, and parking lot starts at the end of this summer! The outpouring of Gift for the Cause support at the 2024 Gala resulted in \$70,000 raised for this work, which will be matched dollar for dollar from the generous 2023 Shipley family and Bare family bequests.

• We have started preliminary planning to move the Society's library and manuscripts to Cockey's. HSCC will employ an interior designer for the new library space which will take on the aesthetic of a classic "private" library while at the same time offer modern amenities for patrons and researchers. A new ad-hoc committee will work alongside a campus campaign committee to make this dream a reality.

• This fall the Society will start the installation of an early 20th century bedroom dedicated to the life and work of Mary Shellman called "Civil War to Suffrage". A grant from the Heart of the Civil War Heritage Area is making this possible! Sarah Coster, a period room and house museum expert from Annapolis, will help us develop this exhibit with a spring 2025 ribbon cutting planned. As you may have heard, walk-in tours of the Shellman House are now free!

A warm welcome to our new Collections Manager Stephanie Eckard! Stephanie and Kyle are working to make the collections more accessible through our Digital Library and Collections Hub. Be sure to check it out at <u>https://hub.catalogit.app/12914</u>

The Rise and Ignominious Decline of the Main Court Hotel

With many old buildings to contemplate in Carroll County, it is sometimes the long-gone structure that really piques my interest. The old Main Court Hotel that once stood across Main Street from the Shellman House is one such building.

In 1775, Jacob Sherman's family supported him in establishing a tavern on King Street (soon to be redesignated Main Street) in an emerging small village in rural Maryland. Sherman was only 19 years old at the time, but proved to be a highly successful entrepreneur, and the tavern thrived. At age 50, having acquired substantial agricultural land, Jacob sold his tavern to Issac Shriver, another successful businessman, and retired to live out his life as a farmer.

In her girlhood memories of Westminster during the 1820s, Katherine Shellman speaks of a small town of 100 buildings, five of which were taverns. We should first note that at that time a tavern was a highly utilitarian enterprise, serving as both a gathering place for the local community and a stopping place for travelers, not generally seen as elegant or luxurious. Travels could find a meal, some supplies, and a bed. And certainly, Westminster was positioned to serve the needs of travelers, with a major turnpike entering from Baltimore and Reisterstown on the East and then, to the west, forking to lead to either Littlestown, Pennsylvania or to Taneytown.

Newspaper accounts of the time frequently mentioned Isaac Shriver's involvement in various commercial, political, or civic activities. When, with Isaac's active involvement, Carroll County was formed, and he provided land for the new courthouse. Court Street then appeared, running from Main Street, between Shriver's tavern and his store, and leading to the courthouse.


By the time of the Civil War, the tavern had evolved into the City Hotel, with expansions to the original structure extending the length on Main Street to about 100 feet and on Court Street to about 70 feet. It is notable that following Corbit's Charge one of the seriously wounded Delaware cavalrymen was taken to the City Hotel to recover. Following the Gettysburg battle, the hotel served as a major hospital for critically wounded soldiers.

Much of our account so far has been derived from newspaper accounts and similar sources. Following the Civil War, Sanborn Fire Insurance maps appeared, providing us with a marvelous source of information regarding the layout and appearance of American towns and cities. The accompanying depiction of the City Hotel is taken from the 1887 Sanborn map of Westminster, Maryland.

Note that on these maps, red represents brick construction, and yellow represents frame construction. Sleeping quarters are on the second floor.

Following a period of success, with a subsequent period of decline, as features became outdated, the City Hotel was closed by 1904. The Main Court Hotel soon opened with steam heat, sanitary plumbing, combination electric light and gas fixtures, and telephones in rooms. And then, by 1918, the building that was "formerly Hotel Main-Court" featured public school rooms, office space, with an automobile garage and storage to the rear. The automobile seems to have taken over Main Street. In 1940, as American Oil prepared to take over management of the property, the grand old hotel was demolished and facilities for automobile sales and service emerged.

City Hotel (later Main Court Hotel), at intersection of Main Street and Court Street, Westminster, MD 1887, credit




