# Tales FROM THE Gardens



The next time you visit the Historical Society of Carroll County check out the two beautyberry bushes located under the magnolia tree behind the Kimmey House. They are two different species, one native and one non-native.

The native one, located farther from the building, is American beautyberry, *Callicarpa Americana*. It is native to the southeastern US, with Maryland being the northern edge




of its range. It is best known for the purple or violet berries it produces in the fall. These berries are utilized as food by many species of song birds and some mam-

mals including squirrels and opossums. The shrubs are robust, fast growing, and often benefit from a cutting back in late winter.



The other beautyberry is one of several species native to China and Japan, probably *Callicarpa Dichotoma*, Chinese beautyberry. Like American beautyberry it is deciduous. Both the leaves and berries are smaller than the American species. It does not grow as vigorously but is still amenable to pruning.

Stop and take a moment to compare the two shrubs and see if one or both would be a good addition to your home landscape.
